User Guide

Overview

New in Version 7.23

- Support for **Bilingual dictionaries**
- **Highlight Bookmarks** – advanced bookmark feature that goes beyond painting with user defined colors to provide study functionality such as attaching user notes to highlighted passages, jumping to the next/previous bookmarked passage with history arrows.
- **Copy feature** now works not only with the current verses but with user defined highlighted passages
- Possibility to choose **Command toolbar** position (top/bottom)
- Improved **Select Commentary** feature - works with an expandable list of icons for selecting commentaries for a more compact view.

Bible With You is a powerful Palm OS Bible reader allowing not only reading and studying the complete texts of different Bible translations, but also using commentary resources, cross-references, dictionaries, images and original language resources. Even challenges like the complete version of Mathew Henry's commentaries are not a hindrance for the excellent performance of the reader. The application supports hires+ and could be installed in the RAM as well as on a Memory Card.

Bible With You is equally convenient for reading as well as for studying the Bible. The user interface is easy-to-use and intuitive.

The biblical texts are presented in rich text, combining bold, italic, colors and multiple font sizes. You could adjust the reading preferences according to your needs. The **Apply bold formatting** feature enforces bold format for the whole text (helpful for users with poor eyesight) and font size remapping increases/decreases the font size even for devices with 160/160 screen. The reading of the Bible is especially facilitated by the **Reading** mode, allowing you to define a set of reading preferences (font size appropriate for reading longer passages, hiding Strong's numbers and other information that, while useful when you do a research, might distract your attention from the text itself). Thus, next time you decide to read the Bible (whether following a plan or not) you will already have your reading preferences saved and will fully concentrate on the reading. Using the **Ribbon** feature you can easily follow a Bible reading plan. The ribbons are automatically updated bookmarks showing the place you stop your reading. The **Auto Scroll** and the **Screen Wrap** features help you fully concentrate on the text.

While when you read the Bible you would like to concentrate on the text, when you study the Bible by yourself or when you take your **Bible With You** on church or at the prayer meeting, you would probably prefer to have information like footnotes and Strong's numbers visible and ready to be used. You might also prefer a different font size than the one you use for reading. That is why **Bible With You** allows setting different study-oriented preferences for a **Study** mode and you can switch between **Study** and **Reading** without changing preferences all the time. The navigation in **Study** mode also differs from this in the **Reading** mode. You can choose between the **Select Bible Verse** feature (consequently choose book, chapter and verse) and the **Graffiti navigation**. The uniqueness of this feature is the opportunity for navigating not only within the active book by drawing chapter and verse numbers in the Number area, but also to choose a Bible book through drawing the corresponding letter abbreviation.

Helpful features for your Bible study are also the possibility for taking **Notes (new for 5.0)**, the significantly improved **Bookmarks (now allowing categories)**, cross-references appearing as pop-ups, cross-references and Strong's definitions working as hyper links, as well as with the **Compare** study mode.

In **Bible With You 6.0** you will find still other study oriented functionality like the possibility for using the available Bible References databases with different translations. For example, you can look at the NASB references while reading KJV. What is more, now you can personalize your study experience by choosing your own set of study resources – Bible, Commentary book, Dictionary, Cross References. The complete version of Mathew Henry's Commentaries for **Bible With You** integrates with the Bible translations by allowing you when switching from the Bible to the **Commentaries** to choose whether to go to the corresponding commentary about the active verse, chapter or book.

The search in the Bible is implemented through a separate program **Bible Concordance With You**, closely integrated with **Bible With You**. The practically instant results allow performing on-tap searches, where the results appear while you enter the words. **Bible Concordance With You** also allows searching for phrases, using advanced options like **OR**, **AND** and even **NOT**. In addition, you can use **wildcards** in your search query. A flexible way for setting the search range gives you the opportunity to easily define the book in which a search will be performed.

For a thematic Bible study you can be facilitated by **Bible Explorer With You**. It comes with several databases like Torrey's New Topical Textbook, Treasury of Scripture Knowledge, Geographical Names in the Bible, GNT Word Index and other.

Bible With You, **Bible Concordance With You** and **Bible Explorer With You** are separate applications, but are closely integrated with each other through the Show Verse Protocol, supported by them, as well as by several other 3rd party products.

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1 Start the application

Locate the **Bible With You** icon on the Applications screen of your Palm OS handheld. Launch the application by tapping on the icon.



2 Registration

2.1 Licenses

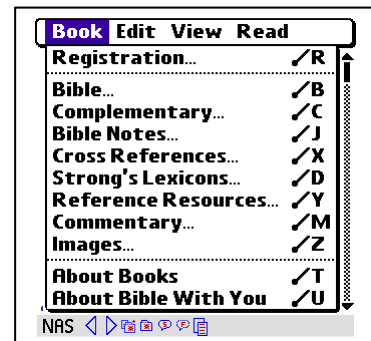
GMPSOft offers the following licenses for using its products:

- 1. Trial License** – Includes all the functionality of the **Standard License** plus indication that the product needs to be registered.
- 2. Standard License** – Indicates that you have successfully licensed a GMPSOft's product.
- 3. Limited License** – Indicates that you have availed of the opportunity for one limited license for a GMPSOft's product. The **Limited License** is free.
- 4. Free License** – Indicates that you have licensed a free GMPSOft's product.

2.2 Product Registration

This fully functioning product can be registered with the help of **PADUnlock** file (**PAlm Database Unlock System**). **PADUnlock** is a standard database file (.pdb) containing your registration information for each of the products you have purchased. You receive your **PADUnlock** file after you order a License for a **GMPSOft** product and register it in our system database.

1. Get your **PADUnlock**:
 - Follow the Unlock Key link in the GMPSOft Sales Confirmation email you have received after the purchase.
 - Click on **GET IT** link in your **Product Info** page.
 - Save the file on your PC
2. Install PADUnlock
 - Hotsync the **PADUnlock** database to your device's RAM or on the expansion card.
3. Go to the **Registration** form:
 - Launch a GMPSOft product
 - Tap on the **Headline** bar or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Book**
 - Tap on **Registration**
 - Or**
 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **R** on the silkscreen
 - Or**
 - Tap on the **Register** button in the trial reminder form

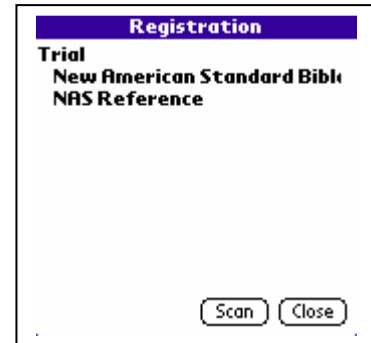


4. Apply your **PADUnlock** registration information:

- Tap on the **Scan** button

GMPSoft products support **PADUnlock** Key protocol and use it to automatically register your products.

Note: The *Trial reminder* form will still appear if there is even one product with a Trial License state.



3 Study Mode

You can use **Bible With You** to read the Bible (see 5. Reading Mode), to study the Bible or a complementary book (see 3. Study Mode) or to compare two Bible versions (4. Comparison Study Mode).

3.1 Select a Bible translation

Bible With You allows having several Bible translations installed and switching between them. When you change the current translation, the active verse will be automatically displayed in the corresponding Bible translation.

1. Open the **Select Books** form

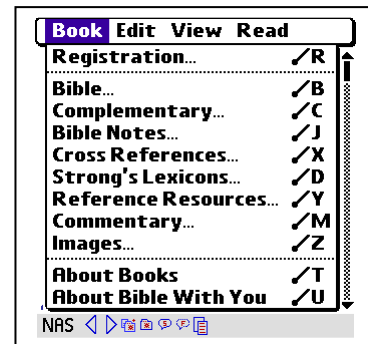
- Tap on the *abbreviation* of the Bible translation in the *Command Toolbar*

Or

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the **Book** menu
- Tap on **Bible...**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **B** on the silkscreen



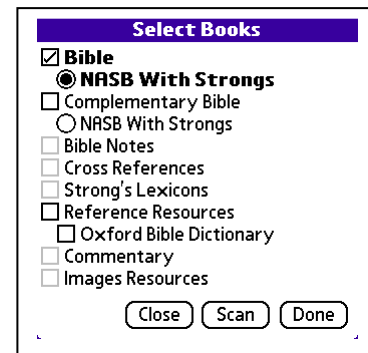
2. Scan for new Bible translations

- Tap on **Scan**

Bible With You stores cached information about the available databases. This speeds the operation when you use memory cards.

It is not necessary to scan each time. Scan when you:

- Install new Bible(s)
- Delete Bible(s)
- Transfer Bible(s) from handheld RAM to the memory card or vice versa
- Move Bible(s) in another folder of the memory card



3. Choose a Bible translation
 - Tap on the desired Bible translation in the list

Gray status of a checkbox indicates one of the following:

- There are no Bible translations or study resources installed (if you have installed a Bible translation or a new resource after the last scan, scan again)
- The Bible translations are not synchronized. You need to download and install the latest version of all GMPSoft products you are using. Get them from our website: www.gmpsoft.com

4. Confirm
 - Tap on the **Done** button

3.2 *Adjusting the preferences*

Bible With You allows adjusting different sets of preferences for reading (see 5.1. Adjusting the Reading Mode *Preferences*) and for studying the Bible. For example, you could have Strong's numbers disabled in **Reading** mode, and enabled in **Study** mode.

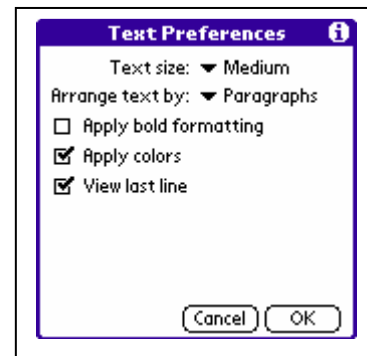
3.2.1 Adjusting the Text Presentation Preferences

Allows choosing the font size, the paragraph or verse formatting, colored or BW display, and view the last line from the previous screen when paging Up/Down.

1. Choose **Text Preferences** from the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on **Text Preferences**

Or

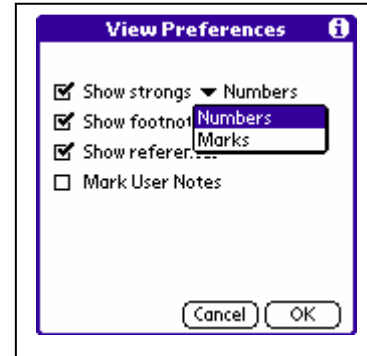
 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **P** on the silkscreen
2. Text size – you can choose **Smaller** size to have more text displayed at a time (if you do a research) or **Larger** (if you memorize verses or use **Bible With You** in church)
 - Tap on the down arrow next to the **Text size** field
 - Choose a text size from the drop down list
3. Arrange the text by Paragraphs/Verses - for Bible study is recommended arrangement by verses
 - Tap on the down arrow next to **Arrange text by**
 - Choose desired formatting from the drop down list



3.2.2 Adjusting the Preferences for Viewing Additional Information

Allows you to choose between showing or hiding the Strong's numbers, the footnotes, the references in the Opens **Bible With You** on the last passage read in the Book, where you have the Ribbon attached.

1. Choose **View Preferences** from the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on **View Preferences**
2. Show Strong's Numbers – enable this option to check what original Hebrew/Greek word is used. For more information about Strong's Numbers see 3.14)



Note: Strong's numbers feature is available only for Bible translations that provide this information.

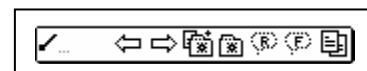
- Enable **Show Strong's** check box
 - Tap on the down arrow next to **Show Strong's** check box
 - Select **Numbers** or **Marks** from the drop-down list
3. Show/hide footnotes – it is recommended this option to be enabled in **Study** mode. For more information about footnotes see 3.12)

Note: Works only for Bible versions providing footnotes

- Tap on **Show footnotes** check box to change alternatively its state

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **Menu** bar
- Tap on the **F** icon



Or

- Tap on **F** icon in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown



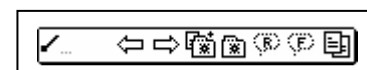
4. Show/hide references - it is recommended this option to be enabled in **Study** mode. For more information about cross-references see 3.13)

Note: Works only for Bible versions providing cross-references

- Tap on **Show references** check box to change alternatively its state

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **Menu** bar
- Tap on the **R** icon



Or

- Tap on **R** icon in the *Command Toolbar* when it is shown



5. View last line

This feature allows you to view the last line of the previous page when paging down the text.

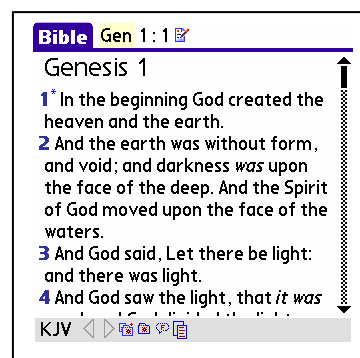
6. Mark User Notes

With this option enabled, Bible With You will place a blue asterisk (*) at the beginning of the verses for which you have added your personal notes

- Enable the **Mark User Notes** check box

7. Confirm

- Tap on the **OK** button



3.3 Adjusting the preferences for the Command Toolbar

The *Command Toolbar* contains icons for easier selection of some of the commands in **Bible With You** reader – *Select Bible translation; Previous/Next passage; Add to Bookmarks, View Bookmarks, Copy* and others.

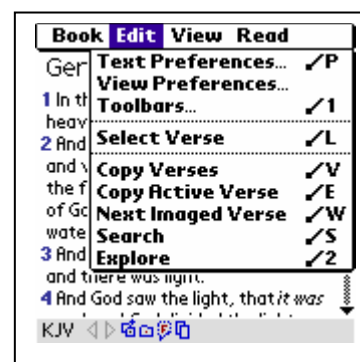
You may choose between 3 modes of the *Command Toolbar* – always hidden, always shown, or, in devices with virtual graffiti silkscreen area – the *Command Toolbar* may be automatically hidden when the graffiti area is displayed. You can also choose to position the *Command Toolbar* – at the top or at the bottom of the screen.

1. Choose **Toolbars** from the **Edit** menu

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on the **Edit** menu
- Tap on **Toolbars...**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the number **1** on the silkscreen



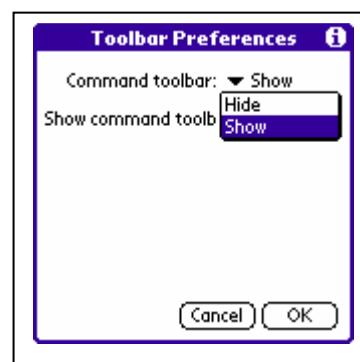
2. Select a status of the *Command Toolbar*

- Tap on the down arrow next to the **Command toolbar** field
- Choose status for the toolbar from the drop down list

Possible statuses of the *Command Toolbar* are:

Hide – the *Command Toolbar* is hidden

Show – the *Command Toolbar* is shown both in 320x320 (160x160) as well as in expanded 320x480 screens



Auto show - the *Command Toolbar* is hidden for 320x320 (160x160) screen displays and is shown for the expanded 320x480 screen.

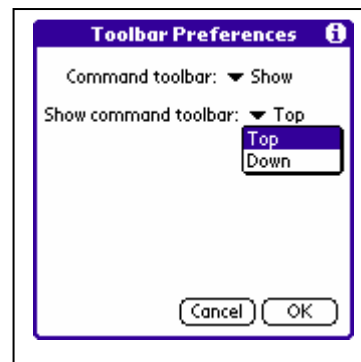
3. Select position for the *Command Toolbar*

- Tap on the down arrow next to **Show Command toolbar** field
- Choose position for the toolbar from the drop down list

The possible positions of the *Command Toolbar* are:

Top – the *Command Toolbar* will be displayed at the top of the text below the *Headline bar*.

Down – the *Command Toolbar* will be displayed at the bottom of the text



4. Confirm your preferences

- Tap on **OK**



3.4 Reading the Bible

1. Read a chapter - when you read the Bible in **Study** mode, the text is presented chapter by chapter.

- Use the scroll bar to move the text up and down within a chapter

Or

- Move the **Sony Jog Dial** wheel up/down to move the text per one line.

2. Activate a verse – when you study a particular verse, you can make this verse active and read the chapter context

- Tap on the desired verse in the text

The active verse will move to the top of the text area.

Active verse is the one displayed in the header section. Scrolling the text does not change the active verse.



3. Jump to the active verse – having read the context of the active verse you can easily return to this verse to continue your study
 - Push and release the Sony **Jog Dial** wheel
 4. Move the text up and down by pages and continue to next/previous chapter
 - Use **Page Up/Page Down** buttons of your handheld
- Or**
- Push the **Sony Jog Dial** wheel and move it up/down.

3.5 Navigation in the Bible

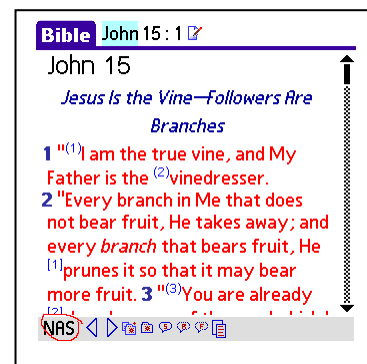
Navigation is an important part of the study process. That is why **Bible With You** offers different ways for navigation in **Study** mode that could be used in different situations and according to your personal preferences.

3.5.1 Form navigation

You can change the active Bible version, book, chapter or verse by tapping on the corresponding field in the **Select Book/Select Chapter/Select Verse** forms. Your choice of active book is facilitated by having the books colored by groups.

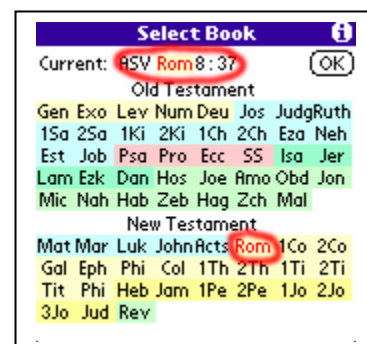
Selection order is from a more general to more specific object (once you have selected a book, the **Select Chapter** form opens. After choosing a chapter, the **Select Verse** form opens).

1. Open the **Select Book/Select Chapter/Select Verse** form
 - Tap on the *book abbreviation* or *chapter/verse number* field in the *Command Toolbar*.
- Or**
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **L**



2. Select a book
 - Tap on a book abbreviation in the **Select Book** form

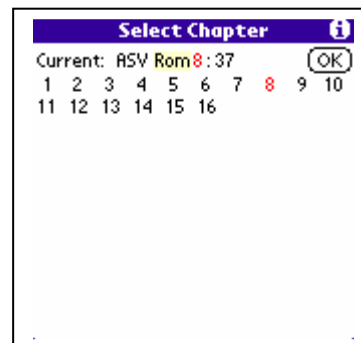
Red font indicates current book



3. Select a chapter

- Tap on the desired number in the list

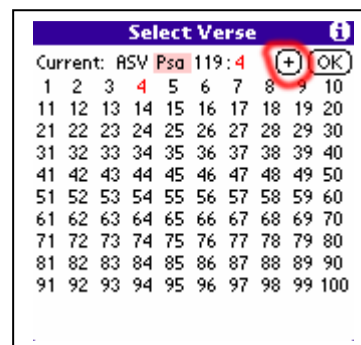
Red font indicates current chapter number



4. Select a verse

- Tap on the respective number in the list

Red font indicates verse number



Important: If the number of chapters or verses is more than one hundred they will be displayed in two forms

5. View more chapter or verse numbers

- Tap on '+' button

6. View smaller chapter or verse numbers

- Tap on '-' button

3.5.2 Graffiti Navigation System

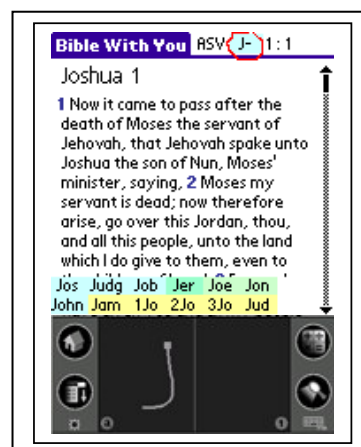
The Graffiti Navigation System allows you to move in the text quickly and conveniently by writing Letters and Numbers in the *Graffiti silkscreen area* or alternatively by entering them with the *Virtual Keyboard*.

1. Select a Bible book

- Write a letter on the **Alpha Graffiti area** or use alternatively the **Virtual** or the **Hardware Keyboard**.

This will activate the Graffiti Navigation System. The first of all books starting with the letter you have entered will become the active book.

If there are several books starting with the same letter, their *abbreviations* will be listed at the bottom of the text area.

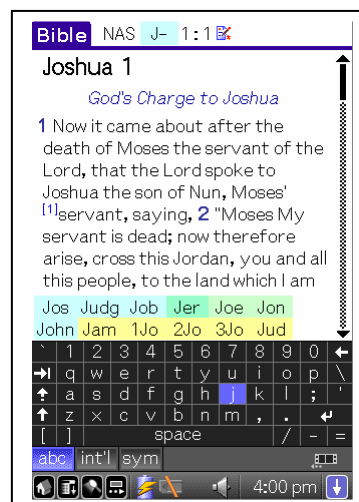


- Now you can choose to enter the next letters of the book abbreviation or to tap on the field with book abbreviations.

The book is finally defined when you have tapped on its abbreviation or you have entered a consequence of letters that uniquely define it.

For example, to go to *Jeremiah*, you need to enter *J*. All the books starting with J will be listed. The second letter - *e* –will define uniquely the book as there are no other books' abbreviations starting with *Je*.

In case the desired book is the first one in the list, just tap once on the silk screen to confirm and deactivate the **Graffiti Navigation System**.



Notes:

1. The **Graffiti Navigation System** is automatically deactivated 5 seconds after you stop entering letters or digits.

2. When you need one book from a set (for example, one of *1Jo*, *2Jo*, *3Jo*), the number of the book is ignored – all three books are interpreted as *Jo*.

Warning: The only way to point one book from the set is to tap on the field with the corresponding book abbreviation.

2. Select a chapter/verse

2.1 Enter a chapter number

- Enter a digit using the **Numeric Graffiti area**, the **Virtual Keyboard**, or the **Hardware Keyboard**.

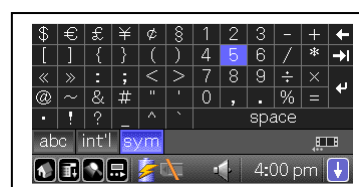
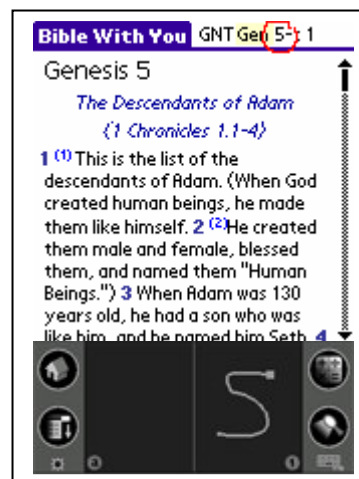
This will activate the **Graffiti Navigation System**.

The *Chapter/Verse* field at the **Menu** bar will show the digit that was entered. If it is followed by a **dash**, this is an indication that more digits can be entered to point a chapter number.

- Enter the next digits of the chapter if this is necessary.

For example, if you want to go to Genesis 50, you need to write 5 and then 0.

Note: When you have entered the desired chapter number, but more digits may be entered (for example, chapter 5 out of 50), you can single tap on the **Numeric area** to confirm.



2.1 Select a verse

Select a verse mode is automatically activated after you have selected a chapter number.

- Continue by entering the digits of the verse number the same way you do for a chapter.

Note: If you need to jump to a verse in the same chapter, tap once on the **Numeric area** to skip entering the chapter number or tap on the dot (.) on the **Virtual Keyboard**, or the **Hardware Keyboard**

Notes:

1. **Bible With You** automatically monitors the digits that have been entered and if the digits entered for a Chapter/Verse number are not valid, the greatest possible Chapter/Verse will be opened.

For example, if you have entered 57 for a chapter number in Genesis (50 chapters), the navigation system will sound a warning signal and **Bible With You** will open the last chapter of Genesis - 50.

2. Graffiti Navigation System is automatically disabled 5 seconds after you stop entering letters or digits.

3. Examples

3.1 Go to *Proverbs 4:3*, no matter where you are at the moment

- Write the letter **P** on the **Alpha Graffiti area**
- Tap on the abbreviation **Pro** in the list of Bible books abbreviations that appears at the bottom of the screen
- Write the digit **4** on the **Numeric area**
- Single tap on the **Numeric area** to confirm
- Write the digit **3**

3.2 Go to *Proverbs 4:23* – when you are in *Proverbs 4:3*

- Single tap on the **Numeric area**
- Write consequently the digits **2** and **3**

3.3 Go to *Jude 24*

- Write the letter **J** on the **Alpha Graffiti area**
- Tap on the abbreviation **Jud** in the list of Bible books abbreviations that appears at the bottom of the screen
- Single tap on the **Numeric area**
- Write consequently the digits **2** and **4**

3.6 Copying Verses

Bible With You allows you to copy a single verse or a whole chapter to paste in other applications.

3.6.1 Copying the Active Verse

1. Activate a verse
 - Tap on the desired verse in the text**Or**
 - Select it as in 3.4 Reading the Bible

The *Active verse* is the one that is displayed at the headline bar. Scrolling up/down the text does not change the active verse.

2. Choose **Copy Active Verse** from the **Edit** menu:
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Edit**
 - Tap on **Copy Active Verse**

Or

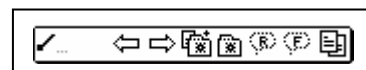
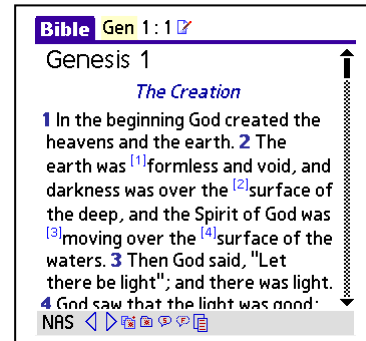
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ to display the *System Toolbar*
- Tap on the *Copy* icon

Or

- Tap on Copy icon in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and write the letter **E** on the silkscreen



3.6.2 Copying Verses

This command allows you to copy all verses from the current selection – a whole chapter or a number of verses displayed from a cross reference.

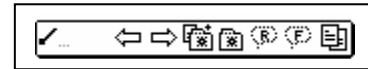
Warning: There might be problems with pasting larger passages in some applications (for example, *Memo Pad*).

1. Choose **Copy Verses** from the **Edit** menu:
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Edit**

- Tap on **Copy Verses**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ to display the command toolbar
- Tap on the *Copy* icon



Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and write the letter **V** on the silkscreen

3.6.3 Copying Highlight Bookmarks

Bible With You allows copying **Highlight Bookmarks** (see section 3.10.)

Important: All text that is part of the **Highlight Bookmark** will be added to clipboard – including the verse numbers, Strong's numbers and numbers of the footnotes or references that may appear in the selection.

1. Add **Highlight Bookmark** to a passage in the Bible

- See how in 3.10 Highlight Bookmarks (Bookmark Passages)



2. Choose **Copy Highlight** from the **Edit** menu:

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **Edit**
- Tap on **Copy Highlight**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and write the number **8** on the silkscreen

Or

- Tap on *Copy Highlight* icon (📄) in the *Command Toolbar*



3.7 History

Bible With You keeps a history list of the passages you have visited allowing you to move back and forward in it. Thus you can read a passage from the Bible, then use an original language resource or a commentary book and with a single stroke return to the place in the Bible where you were.

1. Go to the *previous* passage in the history list

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Previous**

Or

- Draw the **Backspace** Graffiti Stroke on the *silk screen*

Or

- Select **Backspace** button in the **Virtual** or the **Hardware** Keyboard

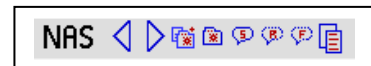
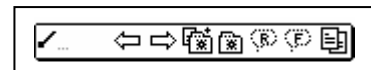
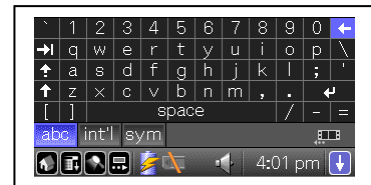
Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **command bar**

- Tap on the *Back* arrow

Or

- Tap on the *Back Arrow* icon in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown



2. Go to the *next* passage in the history list

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Next**

Or

- Draw the **Space** Graffiti Stroke on the *silk screen*

Or

- Select **Space** button in the **Virtual** or the **Hardware** Keyboard

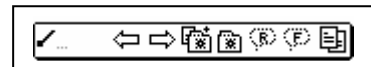
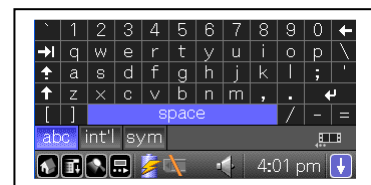
Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **command bar**

- Tap on the *Forward* arrow

Or


- Tap on the *Forward Arrow* icon in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown

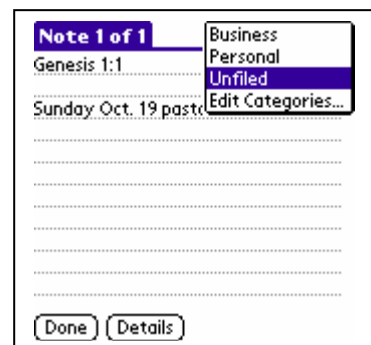
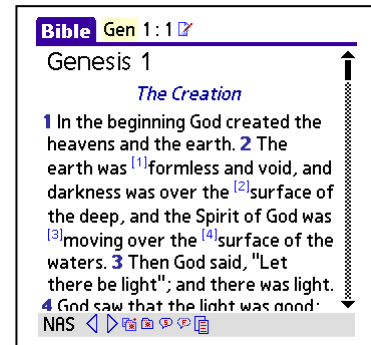


3.8 User Notes

Bible With You allows you to attach and edit your personal notes to the active Bible verse. The attached note is being attached to the number of the verse and not to its text, and therefore, stays the same when you switch to another Bible translation. Only one Note may exist for a particular verse.

3.8.1 Attaching Notes

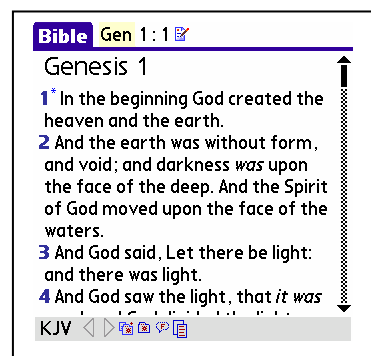
1. Attach a Note
 - Select a verse (See 3.5 Navigation in the Bible)
 - Tap on the **Notes** icon  in the *Headline bar***Or**
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **View**
 - Tap on **Edit Note****Or**
 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **I** on the silkscreen
2. Enter your text
 - Use the *Graffiti* writing area or the System Keyboard
3. Change the Note category
 - Tap on a Notes category displayed at the right top corner of the screen**Or**
 - Click on the **Details** button
 - Select a category from the **Category** list
 - Tap on **OK**



3.8.2 Edit a Note

You may edit a note, if one exists for a particular verse - Same as

- Read 3.8.1. for how to open/edit a Note
- Or**
- Tap on the blue asterisk (*) at the beginning of the verse which indicates an existing Note to open the Edit Note form




3.9 Verse Bookmarks

Bible With You allows you to bookmark your favorite verses and organize the Bookmarks in categories.

3.9.1 Adding Bookmarks

1. Activate the desired verse
 - See 3.4 to learn how
2. Choose **Add to Bookmarks** from the **View** menu:
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **View**
 - Tap on **Add to Bookmarks**

Or

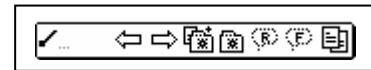
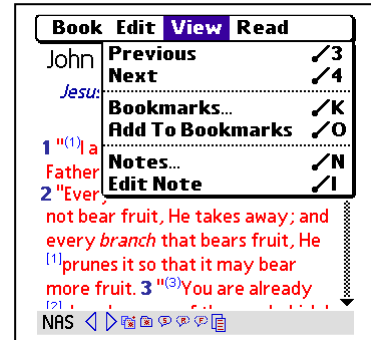
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the command toolbar
- Tap on the *Add to Bookmarks* icon 

Or

- Tap on the  in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **O**



3.9.2 Managing Verse Bookmarks

1. Choose **Bookmarks** from the **View** menu:
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **View**
 - Tap on **Bookmarks**

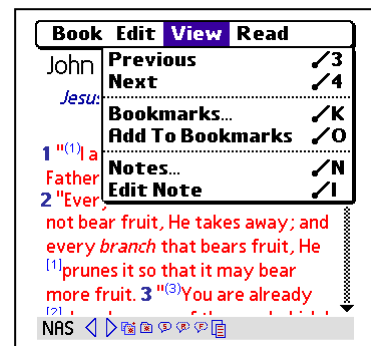
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the command toolbar
- Tap on the *Bookmarks* icon 

Or

- Tap on the  in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown

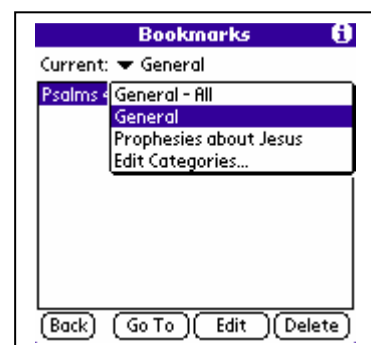

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **K**



Note: You need to have at least one bookmark in order to open the **Bookmarks** form.

2. Select a bookmark



- Tap on it in the list
3. Edit a bookmark – you can change the name of the bookmark and the category it belongs
 - Tap on **Edit**
 - 3.1. Rename the bookmark

By default, Bookmarks are entitled by the respective Bible book and chapter number.

 - Enter the new name
 - 3.2. Change the bookmark's category – you can choose the bookmark's category from the list of current categories or create a new category.
 - Tap on the triangle button against **Current** category
 - Tap on a category in the drop down list
 4. View a bookmark
 - Tap on **Go To**
 - Or**

3.10 *Highlight Bookmarks (Bookmark Passages)*

Bible With You 7.23 allows you to add **Highlight Bookmarks** to passages in the Bible choosing colors for the font, background and the underline.

Bible With You saves each **Highlight Bookmark** in a special category that has its own colors. This is extremely helpful when you want to have the **Highlight Bookmarks** on the same subject with the same colors.


What is more, you can add your personal notes to each particular **Highlight Bookmark**.

Warning: Highlight Bookmarks are being added to a particular Bible translation and may be used only with it. This is because the length of the passage that you bookmark depends on the exact wording of the text in the particular Bible translation. If you change the translation, the wording will be different, so the **Highlight Bookmarks** you have made and the notes that you have added for them will not apply to the new Bible translation.

3.10.1 Turning Highlight Mode ON

The application provides **AND, OR, NOT, Wildcard, Phrases search**, search in specified books of the Bible, **Show Verse Excerpt, Show Verse Protocol** via launching **Bible With You** and other features.

Note: **Bible Concordance With You** requires a separate License.

Searches in **Bible With You** are implemented by **Bible Concordance With You** application which supports the Show Verse Protocol (See Section 7).

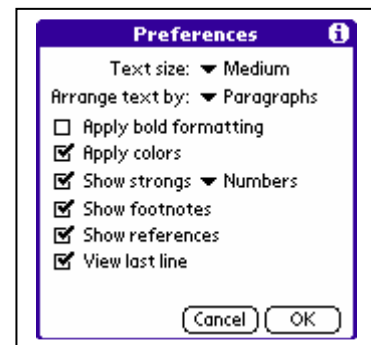
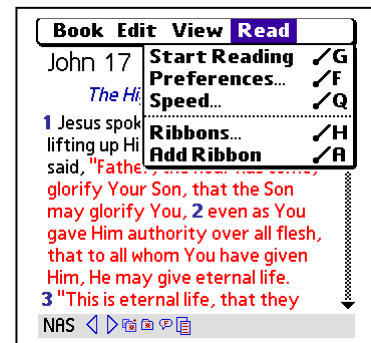
5 Reading Mode

The **Reading** mode of **Bible With You** is especially designed to enhance your reading experience allowing you to define a set of reading preferences (font size appropriate for reading longer passages, hiding Strong's numbers, footnotes and references). Thus, next time you decide to read the Bible (whether following a plan or not) you will already have your reading preferences saved and you will fully concentrate on the reading without losing time in changing preferences from study-friendly to reading-friendly. Using the **Ribbon** feature you can easily follow a Bible reading plan. The navigation in the **Reading** mode is designed to help you fully concentrate on the reading process, especially the **Auto Scroll** and the **Screen Wrap** modes.

5.1 Adjusting the Reading Mode Preferences

Bible With You allows defining different sets of preferences for reading and for studying the Bible (see 3 Study Mode). For example, you could have Strong's numbers disabled in the **Reading** mode, and enabled in the **Study** mode, applied bold formatting in the **Reading** mode.

1. Open the **Preferences** form
 - Tap on the **Bible With You** bar or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Preferences...**
2. Select a **Reading** mode option – these options refer to the navigation. In **Manual** mode you use the **Page Down** button to scroll down, while in **Auto Scroll** and **Screen Wrap** modes the text moves down automatically, you only adjust the speed.

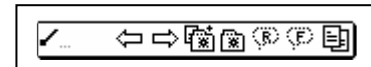

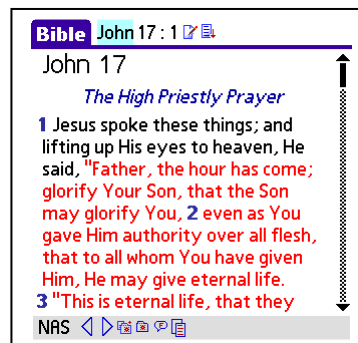

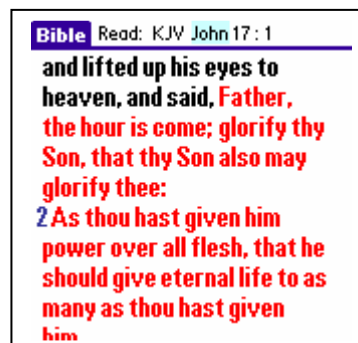

 - Tap on **Start Reading**
- Or**
- Tap on the  icon if you have selected a ribbon to continue reading (See 5.3 Ribbons)



2. Increase speed

- Press and hold the **Page Down** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

- Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel Downward

3. Decrease speed

- Press and hold the **Page Up** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

- Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward

4. Pause

- Press and hold any of the rest Hardware Buttons (Launcher, Menus, Calculator, Find)

Or

- Press and hold the Sony Jog Dial wheel

5. Determine the most appropriate speed:

- Go to a verse you would like to start from
- Start reading (see point.1)
- if you manage to read the text until under 2-3 lines from the centre of the page, press **Page Down** button to accelerate.
- Repeat, until you keep reading the text in the centre.
- Best speed for you is the one at which you read the text close to the centre

Notes:

1. If you have lost concentration, just pause **Autoscroll**.
 2. Once you have determined the appropriate for you speed, you need only to use the buttons for Pausing, when you need to stop for a while.
 3. If you change any of the Preferences (for example text size), repeat the procedure to obtain the most appropriate speed for the new preferences. If necessary, press **Page Up** beforehand to decrease the speed.
- ## 6. Exit the **Autoscroll** mode
- Press anywhere on the screen - you could do this even by tapping on the screen with your thumb.


5.2.2 Screen Wrap Mode

In the **Screen Wrap** mode, next page is being smoothly rolled down from the top of the screen, while the user is reading the current page. The user may adjust the speed of updating of the screen or may just pause.

1. Initiate Reading

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **Read**
- Tap on **Start Reading**

Or

- Tap on the  icon if you have selected a ribbon to continue reading (See 5.3 *Ribbons*)

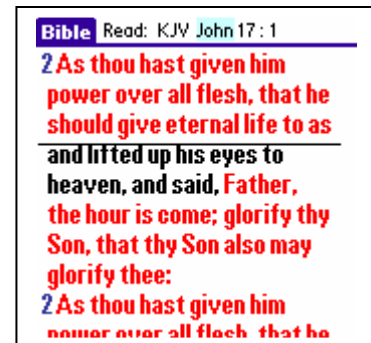
2. Increase speed

- Press and hold the **Page Down** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

- Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward

3. Decrease speed



- Press and hold the **Page Up** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

- Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward

4. Pause

- Press and hold any of the rest Hardware Buttons (Launcher, Menus, Calculator, Find)

Or

- Press and hold the Sony Jog Dial wheel

5. Determine the most appropriate speed:

- go to a verse you would like to start from
- Start reading (see point.1)
- If you are reading too close above the horizontal line, accelerate with the **Page Down** button
- If you are reading too close under the horizontal line, slow down with the **Page Up** button

Notes:

1. Try to keep reading not too close to the horizontal line.
2. Disregard the moving of the horizontal line for better reading.
3. If you have lost concentration, just pause **Screen Wrap**.
4. Once you have determined the most appropriate speed, you need only to use the buttons for Pausing, when you need to stop for a while.
5. If you change any of the Preferences (for example text size), repeat the procedure to obtain the most appropriate speed for the new preferences. If necessary, press **Page Up** beforehand to decrease the speed.

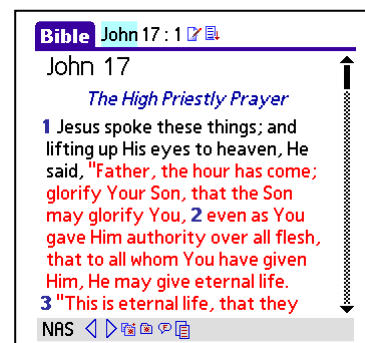
5.2.3 Manual Mode

In the **Manual** mode, the user scrolls the text manually one page/line up with the help of the hardware buttons or the Sony Jog Dial wheel.

1. Move the text per line
 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward
2. Move the text per page
 - Press **Page Down** hardware button

Or

 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel Downward



3. Exit the **Manual** reading mode
 - Press anywhere on the screen - you could do this even by tapping on the screen with your thumb

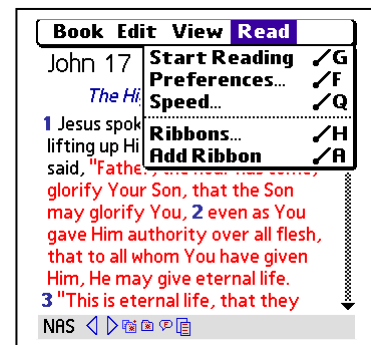
5.3 Ribbons

Bible With You allows you to add user marks, called ribbons, in **Reading** mode (see) to save the last passage read in a certain Bible book. Next time **Bible With You** is used, the you may continue reading this book from the same place. You can add an unlimited number of ribbons in order to keep track of the reading progress in different parts of the Bible. For example, different ribbons may be added for a book in the OT, in the NT, for a poetical book, etc and thus you can easily follow a reading plan.

Important: In order for ribbons to save the last passage you have read from a particular selection, you need to activate **Reading Mode** (see 5.2).

5.3.1 Add a Ribbon

- Select the Bible book, chapter and verse, from which you would like the ribbon to start.
- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **Read**
- Tap on **Add Ribbon**



5.3.2 Go To a Ribbon

Opens **Bible With You** on the last passage read in the Book, where you have the Ribbon attached.

1. Open **Ribbons** form
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Ribbons**
2. Select a Ribbon from the list
 - Tap on one in the list
3. Go to the text
 - Tap on **Go To** button
4. Start Reading mode

5. Exit Reading Mode

- See **5.2 Exit the Reading** mode for instructions

Note: When you exit the **Reading** mode, the Ribbon will save the information about the last passage you have read.

5.3.3 Edit a Ribbon

Allows you to edit the Ribbon anchor and its title.

1. Open **Ribbons** form
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Ribbons**
2. Select a Ribbon
 - Tap on one in the list
3. Open the **Edit Ribbon** form
 - Tap on the **Edit** button
4. Edit **Ribbon** anchor
 - Tap on the Book name in the **Ribbon at** field
This will open the **Select Book** form Select Book, chapter and verse (See 3.5.1 Form navigation)
5. Edit a Ribbon name
 - Enter a new name in the **Name** field using the *Graffiti* area or the *Virtual Keyboard*
6. Confirm
 - Tap on the **OK** button

5.3.4 Delete a Ribbon

- Tap on the **Delete** button in the **Ribbons** form

5.4 Auto Off Power

Palm PDAs have very short intervals for auto-powering off.

To give you more time for continuous reading, **Bible With You** overrides these settings in the Reading mode.

To prevent your battery from draining, a warning message will be displayed 20 minutes after you have started any of the Reading modes.

1. Continue your reading:
 - Tap on OK button
2. Leave Reading mode
 - Tap on **STOP** button



If you don't choose either option within the time interval set for Auto-off in your device's preferences, the Reading mode will be exited and your device will be Powered Off.

6 Study Books

Bible With You integrates a number of additional books for studying the Bible – original language resources, cross-references, commentaries, lexicons, dictionaries, images, etc.

Study Books are database add-ons for **Bible With You** and are separate GMPSoft products purchased apart from the application.

Some of them - like commentary books and dictionaries, are independent from the current Bible translation. Others require a special type of a Bible translation – for example, Hebrew/Greek lexicons must be installed if there is installed a Bible translation that supports Strong's numbers.

For more information about each Study Book, read its product description and its User Guide.

6.1 *Cross References*

Bible With You supports cross references in the text - links in the text to other verses in the Bible.

Cross references have been released for only a number of Bible translations and are associated with a particular Bible translation -for example, cross references for the NASB Bible, for the ESV Bible, etc.

The information about cross references in **Bible With You** is provided by separate GMPSoft add-on products, **Bible Cross References**.

When **Bible Cross References** are activated for the matching Bible translation (for example, **Bible Cross References (NASB)** in **Bible With You (NASB)**), cross reference numbers are displayed at the exact places in the verses.

If they are activated for another Bible translation (for example, **Bible Cross References (NASB)** in **Bible With You (ASV)**), cross reference numbers are indicated in the beginning of the verse.

6.2 Hebrew/Greek Lexicons

Hebrew/Greek Lexicons are add-ons for **Bible With You** providing information about the original Hebrew and Greek words, which are indicated by Strong's numbers in the text. Because of that, they require Bible translations which include the Strong's numbers in the text – the product title includes **wS: Bible With You (KJVwS)**.

6.3 Commentaries

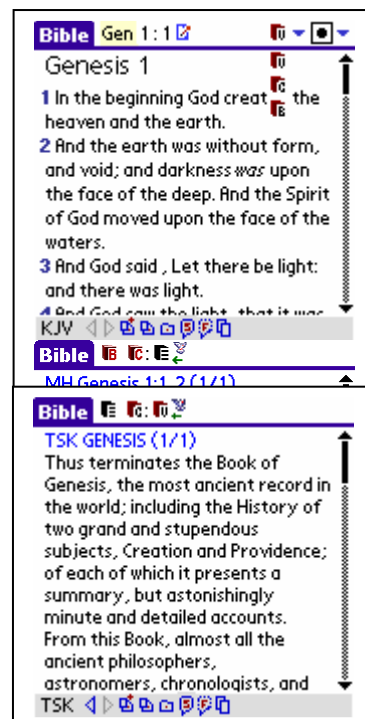
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Notes:

- When a commentary book is installed, **Bible With You** will display the **B**, **C** or **V** icon selector in the Headline bar ( ). The **B**, **C** and **V** icons indicate commentary entries for the current **Book**, **Chapter** or **Verse** in the Bible.
- Some commentary books may provide entries only for verses in the Bible or for verses and chapters. This depends on the particular resource that is used.



1. Go to a verse in the Bible
2. Select to read commentary entry to the current Book, Chapter or Verse
 - Tap on the  button in the Commentary selector icon  
3. View commentary
 - Tap on one of the icons - **B**, **C** or **V** that will be displayed
4. Read commentary
 - Use the Scroll Bar or Hardware buttons
5. View a cross reference
 - Tap on a cross-reference link in the text
6. Exit the commentary book
 - Tap on the  shortcut icon on the **Headline** toolbar



6.4 Dictionaries

Dictionaries are add-ons for **Bible With You**, providing pop-up definitions for words in the Bible. Dictionaries may be used with **Bible With You** for any Bible translation. **Dictionaries With You** are separate GMPSoft products and require a separate License.

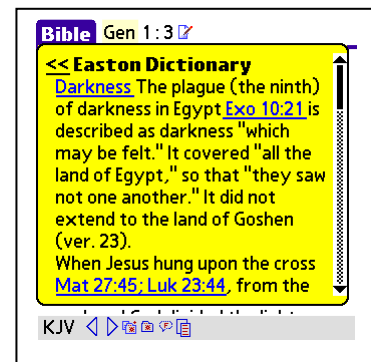

- Tap on a blank space in the pop-up or on the Bible text

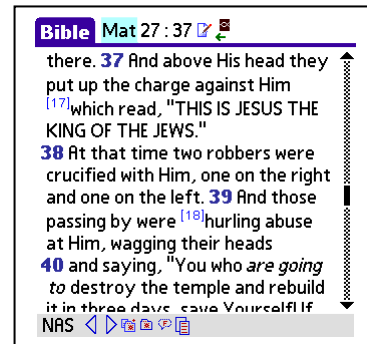


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Bible With You is integrated with a number of other PDA applications. The **Show Verse Protocol** feature, provided by **Bible With You**, allows the other applications to start **Bible With You** to visualize the Bible text. A shortcut icon allows you to return from **Bible With You** directly to the launcher application.
